Welcome to the final block for Reception! We are very excited to adventure into a world of stories for our final 10 weeks together. We will be taking part in lots of storythemed activities and exploring traditional tales. I am Mrs Fischer and I am the Reception Class Teacher. We have a wonderful network of support staff in EYFS in the form of Miss Pickford and Mrs Stewart.

In Foundation Stage 2 we love to learn through exploring our environment. We have lots of exciting learning spaces throughout our class, inside and outside. In the morning we will have early bird activities for your child to access before 9.00am when we then register the children and the day begins. For the majority of the day we can choose when and where we play, inside and outside. Challenges are set in areas of the classroom for the children to complete linked to the different areas of learning.

Curriculum

The new EYFS Framework and Development Matters are the basis of our curriculum which gives statements for the ages of the children. We share this with parents and base the next steps for the children on this.

The planning focus for each term and each week is taken from the Long-Term Plan, the agreed focus, the previous week's findings, the interests of the children and the next steps.

Every day we also get together in small and larger groups for teaching sessions focusing on RE, Maths, Literacy, Phonics, PHSE, Circle Time etc.

There are so many different and wonderful things to do in our class, we firmly believe in having lots of fun, having a go, following our interests and learning through play.

Our theme this block is 'What's the Story?'

Over the next 10 weeks we're going on an adventure to explore the world of books! We will learn about the difference between traditional tales and more modern stories as well as exploring the work of lots of different authors. We will think about our favourite characters and share stories of our own. We will continue to use the Tales Toolkit scheme to write our own stories and will develop our confidence to share these with our friends. The stories we will focus on will include Goldilocks and the Three Bears, Little Red Riding Hood, Zog, We're Going on a Bear Hunt and 'Don't Read This Book!'.

You can help at home in a number of ways including reading a variety of Traditional Tales to support your child to be as familiar with these stories as possible. Discuss the beginning, middle and end of stories and how the writer keeps the reader interested.

Physical Development

Please read with your child each night building up to 10mins.



Children will have 2 books:

- Decodable reader These books are to practise specific phonic sounds and may stay with your child for several weeks.
- **Shared reader** These books are for you to share with your child to encourage a love of reading and include some of the Oxford Reading Tree Scheme books and some fiction, non-fiction and poetry. These reading books will be collected in and changed **twice a week**.

Children's reading books will be changed on a **Monday** and **Thursday**. Please make sure you have signed the reading record or books will not be changed.



The children will move up colour bands. They will move up to the next colour band when they can fluently and audibly read the words as well as understand the content of what they have read

Children will also have a log in to Reading Eggs. You are able to access this from home, children are encouraged to use this at home.

Handwriting

Children will be given handwriting to practice each Thursday, to be completed by the following **Thursday**.

<u>Maths</u>

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Children will have a small Maths homework book with a weekly number task set in it to complete at home. This will also be set each **Thursday**, to be completed by the following **Thursday**.

Children will be provided with a log in for:

Reading Eggs – An interactive platform where children can complete reading-based activities and games.

Purple Mash – An interactive platform with access to activities and games covering all other areas of the curriculum.

Below is what we will be learning and ways in which you can support your child at home:

Religious Education:

<u>New Life</u>

As we return from the Easter break, we are celebrating that Jesus is Alive. We will be learning about the time Jesus spent with his disciples after the resurrection. The children will hear stories from the Bible about what Jesus did before ascending into Heaven and how we are tasked with continuing His mission on Earth.

What you can do to help:

- Talk to the children about your family/ what activities you like to do together
- Thank God for our families, in your prayers
- Talk about signs of new life during the season of spring.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

Children will be encouraged to describe self in positive terms and talk about abilities. They will explain their own knowledge and understanding and asks appropriate questions of others. Children will begin to accept the needs of others and can take turns and share resources, sometimes with support from others.

What you can do to help:



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- Encourage your child to put their own shoes and coat on
- Ask your child to help with simple jobs at home
- Encourage your child to get dressed and undressed independently.

Communication and Language

Children will be given lots of opportunities to maintain attention, concentrate and sits quietly during appropriate activities. They will begin to follow a story without pictures or props. They will begin to question why things happen and give explanations. Asks e.g. who, what, when, how.

What you can do to help:

- Read stories to your child and ask them questions.
- Talk to them about what they have done at school.
- Use the class dojo pictures as a starting point.
- Encourage them to question why things happen.

Physical Development

Children will begin to form recognisable letters holding a pencil between thumb and two fingers, no longer using whole-hand grasp. Shows some understanding that good practices with regard to exercise, eating, sleeping and hygiene can contribute to good health. Children will continue to develop gross motor skills in PE sessions these will include dance.

What you can do to help:

Encourage your child to draw pictures.





- Complete homework activities that are provided weekly. •
- Read with your child <u>DAILY</u> when possible – this is extremely important.

Phonics

We will continue phonics using the letters and sounds scheme of work where we will be covering the Phase 2-4 sounds. The children will give meaning to marks they make as they draw, write and paint. They will segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together and know which letters represent some of them. They will ascribe meanings to marks that they see in different places.

What you can do to help:

- Read with your child
- Complete handwriting homework.
- Encourage your child to spot letters in the environment and say the sound they make.

<u>Maths</u>

Children will select the correct numeral to represent 1 to 5, then 1 to 10 objects or beyond. Find one more or one less from a group of up to five objects, then ten objects. Shows interest in shape by sustained construction activity or by talking about shapes or arrangements.

What you can do to help:

- Recognise the numerals 1-10 and beyond.
- Talk about shapes that you see in the environment.
- Encourage your child to count objects/toys saying the number names in the correct order.
