This academic year, our focus is on what it means to be valued in all that we do. For Year 6, this means living out the gospel value of kindness in everything we do. We will reflect on how our words, choices and actions can demonstrate care and respect for others, ensuring that everyone feels included and appreciated.

We take inspiration from Jesus, who showed kindness to all he met, especially those who were lonely, excluded or in need. Like Him, we will challenge ourselves never to give up on showing love and compassion, even when it is difficult.

PE

PE takes place every Wednesday (forest school) and Thursday. Block 1

This term in Year 6, we've explored the fascinating Maya civilisation. We studied their gods, social hierarchy and structure, and impressive calendar and astronomy. The children compared these aspects to modern society, gaining a deeper understanding of how the Maya lived, governed and understood the world around them.

In science, we studied 'Living Things and Their Habitats', including Inheritance and Evolution, learning how animals adapt and how traits are passed through generations.

Our art lessons focused on the expressive watercolour style of Ewa Czarniecka, where children experimented with blending, layering and brush techniques to create stunning landscapes.

It's been a term full of curiosity, creativity and thoughtful learning - Year 6 have impressed us with their enthusiasm and growing independence across all subjects!

Block 2

In block 2, our concept question is: How do fear, reform, and responsibility influence the way humans treat each other and care for their health?

Through our history topic, 'Changes in Punishment Over Time', we'll consider how fear and reform have shaped justice and influenced the way society treats people.

In science, our study of the circulatory system, diet, exercise and drugs will help us reflect on personal responsibility and how our choices affect our health.

In PE, we will be continuing with our rugby sessions and starting forest school. These sessions help children build confidence, resilience, and teamwork skills while developing their observation and problem-solving abilities.

Finally, in DT, we'll express care and creativity by designing a Christmas decoration as a keepsake of our time at St Simon's.
