
This year our class will be known as **Peace Class**, a name that reflects one of the most precious values of our Catholic faith. Peace is at the heart of Jesus' message: He calls us to be peacemakers, to bring harmony where there is conflict, and to share God's love through understanding. In our school community, peace means learning to listen, to forgive, and to treat others with patience and respect. By striving to live peacefully, our students grow in confidence as valued individuals, creating a safe and welcoming space where everyone can flourish.



Our theme for Block 1 is **How far can we travel?** We will explore this question through the themes of **Diversity** and **Belonging**.

We will be reading Old Bear, along with other stories including the traditional tale, Rapunzel. Your child will write labels and captions for pictures and use different drama

strategies to aid their writing. We will learn about Transport in History and create a time line. In Science we will learn about different materials and their uses. In Maths we will focus on place value within 10 and then look at how we can add and subtract within 10.









We use a scheme called **Essential Letters and Sounds** to teach phonics. There is a daily phonics lesson where the teacher teaches a new sound, or reviews sounds learned earlier in the week

During the summer term your child will take the **Phonic Screening Check**. The Phonics Check occurs annually in June for all Year 1 children. Children read 40 real and pseudo (made up) words to test their phonics decoding ability. The pass mark is usually 32. Your child's score will be reported to you on their end of year report.

Religious Education In **RE** we will be learning about **Creation and Covenant** until half term and then will move onto **Prophecy and Promise** until Christmas. In Year 1, the children have **3** different homework activities each week: 1) Maths –Workbook

- * Children will use a work book to complete the work.
- * A page in the booklet will be set a **Friday** and will be due the following **Thursday**.

2) Reading - online

- * Children will use Reading Eggs.
- * A comprehension lesson will be set on a **Friday** and will be due the following **Friday**.



3) Spelling - spelling homework books

- * Children will receive 6 spellings to practise a week.
- * Children need to pick 1 activity from the spelling activities list inside the front cover of their spelling homework book and complete it.
- * Spellings are given out on a **Friday** and children will be tested on these words the following Friday.



Please read for a **minimum of 10 minutes** every night.

Children will have 2 books:

- <u>Decodable reader</u> These books are to practise specific phonic sounds and may stay with your child for several weeks.
- <u>Shared reader</u> These books are for you to share with your child to encourage a love of reading and include fiction, non-fiction and poetry. These reading books will be collected in and changed twice a week.

Please ensure your child's reading packet (with their decodable reader, shared reader and reading record) is in school every day and that your child's reading record is filled in every time they read and signed once they have finished their book in order that it can be changed. The children will move up colour bands for their Shared Reader as their reading progresses. They will move up to the next colour band when they can fluently and audibly read the words as well as understand the content of what they have read. They need to be able to confidently answer a BOOK Reception Υ1 **BANDS** range of questions such as: recalling the events of **PINK EMERGING** the story, predicting what might happen next and why, deducing the meaning of words from the RED DEVELOPING context clues on the page, inferring why a YELLOW SECURE character did or said something and we focus on BLUE MASTERED **EMERGING** other areas too. GREEN DEVELOPING This is how book bands progress from Reception to SECURE Year 1: ORANGE **TURQUOISE** SECURE+ **PURPLE MASTERED** The children's books will be changed on **Tuesday** and **Friday**. PE We will be doing PE every **Monday** and **Tuesday**. The children will need to make sure they come into school in their PE kits on these days. Please ensure children come in outdoor PE kits as we will try to be outside as much as possible. Your child's PE kit should consist of plain navy joggers/leggings, a light blue polo top and their school jumper or cardigan with trainers. Class Dojo The school uses Class Dojo as a way to promote STRIVE as well as being an opportunity for you to contact me about any query you may have. Your child will receive positive points on this site for displaying the key skills within **STRIVE**. Please make sure you have signed up so that we can share all our learning with you.
