### What did we learn in Block 1?


The children of Year 4 have made a fantastic start to the year. In Block One, they showcased their enthusiasm and curiosity across all areas of learning. In English, the children wrote a descriptive setting narrative, then produced an exciting newspaper report about a suspicious marine species that has entered the deep, dark depths of the sea. In Maths, they strengthened their place value knowledge and worked hard to secure their understanding of the four operations.

Through their topic work, the children immersed themselves in the history of Ancient Greece, exploring its culture, daily life and lasting influence. In Computing, they learnt the importance of keeping themselves safe online and knowing that they can reach out to their trusted adults should they be worried about SPAM or inappropriate content. In PE the children enjoyed developing accuracy and teamwork in preparation for learning the rules of dodgeball. In Science, they explored the characteristics of living things including plants and animals, and how they are classified. Overall, Block One has been a productive and engaging start to Year 4 and the children should be proud of all they have achieved.

We will access this through the themes of beauty, fear and change.

### What will we be learning in this block?

During this block of learning, the children will develop their understanding of Europe by learning to locate the continent's major countries, including Russia and identifying their capital cities. They will explore key physical features such as significant mountains and rivers, building a geographical foundation that supports their historical studies. With this knowledge, the pupils will then compare their own local area with a contrasting region in Europe. Their focus will be on Greece and Rome, two ancient civilisations whose landscapes, cultures, and histories have shaped the world we live in today.

In Literacy, we will be continuing to launch our new Ready Steady Write scheme of learning, which provides children with enriched opportunities to enhance their sentence structure and grammar skills in preparation for planning, writing and editing a successful outside narrative and polar bear information text inspired by our focus narrative Leaf by Sandra Dieckmann.

This term, in Maths, the children will continue to build confidence and fluency in key mathematical concepts. They will be securing their understanding of multiplication and division, using a range of strategies to solve problems and deepen their number sense. Alongside this, pupils will explore length and perimeter, learning how to measure accurately, compare units, and calculate the perimeter of different shapes. Later in the term, the children will move on to developing their understanding of fractions. They will learn to recognise and represent fractions in different ways, compare and order them, and apply their knowledge to practical and problem-solving contexts. Through hands-on tasks, guided practice, and real-life applications, pupils will strengthen their mathematical reasoning and broaden the skills needed for future learning.

In Design and technology, the children will explore the world of food design through a festive biscuit project. They will begin by sampling a variety of biscuits, carefully evaluating each one based on taste, texture and smell. By identifying the strengths and weaknesses of existing products, pupils will develop an understanding of what makes a successful biscuit and what could be improved.

Using their findings, the children will then design their own Christmas-themed gingerbread biscuit. They will plan its shape, flavour and decoration, considering both creativity and practicality. Following their design plans, pupils will make and decorate their biscuits, developing key skills in measuring, mixing and assembling ingredients. To conclude the project, the children will evaluate their finished biscuits, reflecting on what worked well and what they might change next time. Their final products will then be packaged and sold at the school Christmas fair, giving pupils real-life experience of designing for a purpose.
