### **What did we learn in Block 3?**

Year 3 have thoroughly enjoyed our topics in Block 3 and have been very enthusiastic learners! This block we investigated the question, 'How did power, belief and community shape the lives of the Ancient Egyptians?' We particularly enjoyed learning about the Ancient Egyptian beliefs on the afterlife and learnt about their process of mummification by mummifying tomatoes!

In our RE and Faith Explorers lessons, we have deepened our understanding of our faith. We understand the importance of saying sorry for our mistakes and trying our best to show God that we will do better each time. We also have a greater understanding of the Mass and some of us have received the Sacrament of First Forgiveness.

We have developed our understanding of fractions, length and perimeter, mass and capacity, where we had lots of opportunity for practical activities. We particularly enjoyed using a ruler to measure items in the classroom and going onto the playground to measure water using jugs and measuring cylinders!

## What we will be learning in Block 4

In this block of learning, we will investigate the question:

**How do resilience, strength and truth help us to understand and navigate the world around us?**



In R.E. this block, we will take on the topics '**Ends of the Earth**' until half term, followed by the topic '**Dialogue and Encounter**' for the final half term. Our Faith Explorers lessons will focus on learning about, and preparing the children for, the Sacrament of First Holy Communion.

Our key texts this block will be 'Egyptology' by Dugald Steer, where we will be inspired to write an **Egyptian Mystery Narrative** and a **Secret Diary entry**, and 'Into the Forest' by Anthony Browne, where we will write a **Lost Narrative**. Handwriting will continue to be a big focus point for Year 3, with the expectation that children can join their handwriting confidently by the end of the academic year. Any handwriting practise you can do at home would be beneficial to help accelerate your child's handwriting progress.

In Maths we will continue our learning from Year 2 on **Time**, progressing to telling the time by the minute and using digital clocks. We will also deepen our knowledge of the **Properties of Shape** and learn about different ways we can record results in our **Statistics** topic. Please encourage your child to continue practising the **2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10** times tables at home.



In Science, we will focus on **Magnets and Forces** and continue our learning on **Plants**. We will compare and group together different types of magnets, learn about different forces and investigate which materials are magnetic and non-magnetic.

**P.E.** will take place every **Monday** and **Wednesday**.

On PE days, the children should come to school wearing their appropriate P.E. kits:

- Navy blue shorts or joggers
- Pale blue polo shirt
- Red school jumper

Monday's PE lessons will be **Swimming** lessons. The children should wear their swimming costume/trunks under their PE kit and bring a towel with them (as well as underwear to change into after their swimming lesson). Our outdoor lessons will be **Outdoor and Adventurous Activities** up to half term and then **Athletics** for the final half term.



## Homework:

### 1. Reading books

In Year 3, children should read for 20 minutes every evening and this should be recorded in their reading records. The reading records will be collected on a **Tuesday** and **Friday**, in order for the Year 3 team to monitor the children's reading. **Please ensure your child's reading book and record is in school every day.**

### 2. Spelling

Children will be given some spelling words to learn on a **Monday** and will be tested on these words the following **Monday**.

Children will be provided with a spellings homework book and they should pick two activities from the spelling activities list to complete each week.

### 3. Maths

This year the children will receive a weekly written maths task inside their White Rose Homework books. This task will coincide with learning taking place in the classroom for that week, enabling children to consolidate their understanding of different mathematical strands. The children continue to have access to TTRockstars which they can log into and use to aid their knowledge of times tables. Purple Mash also has lots of Maths games which the children can access from home.

Homework will be set on a **Friday** and is due in for the following **Thursday**.

### 4. Reading (online)

Online reading homework will be set every **Friday** to be completed by the following **Thursday**. Children will use Reading Eggspress, which they are familiar with as they used it throughout EYFS and KS1. A comprehension lesson will be set for them to complete that will automatically pop up on screen when they login to their account.
