This academic year, our focus is on what it means to be valued in all that we do. For Year 6, this means living out the gospel value of kindness in everything we do. We will reflect on how our words, choices and actions can demonstrate care and respect for others, ensuring that everyone feels included and appreciated.

We take inspiration from Jesus, who showed kindness to all he met, especially those who were lonely, excluded or in need. Like Him, we will challenge ourselves never to give up on showing love and compassion, even when it is difficult.

PE

PE takes place every Tuesday and Thursday. On these days, children will be expected to attend school in their PE kit, which consists of navy blue joggers/leggings, a pale blue polo shirt and their normal school jumper/cardigan.

Block 1

Welcome to Block 1! This term, our learning is driven by the question:

"How do communities take responsibility for living things and what can the Mayans teach us about change in nature and civilisation?"

Across our subjects, we will be exploring the themes of <u>change</u>, <u>community</u>, and <u>responsibility</u>. In RE, we will reflect on Creation and Covenant - considering Christian beliefs about how people are called to live in harmony with God, one another, and the world.

Using our new literacy scheme, our lessons will centre on Rose Blanche, a powerful story about a young girl in Nazi Germany who witnesses her community change as war takes hold. Through her eyes, we will explore courage and responsibility, producing a diary entry and a bravery speech that give voice to her experiences.

In maths, we return to the Number strand, revisiting the key skills from Year 5 and extending them further. Children will deepen their understanding of place value and build confidence in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

In science, we will extend our knowledge of biology with our topic 'Living Things and Their Habitats', where we will focus on classification, evolution and inheritance, developing our understanding how living things are grouped, how they adapt and how they change over time.

By weaving these subjects together, the children will not only gain knowledge and skills but also reflect on the bigger ideas of responsibility within communities - both in the past and today. It promises to be a rich and thought-provoking start to the year.
