What did we learn in Block 2?

In Block 2 we continued to show a great love and eagerness for learning! We read 'Fox' by Margaret Wild, where the children worked towards writing their own fable narrative with a cliff hanger. In Maths, we learnt how to multiply and divide by 3, 4 and 8, and moved on to multiplying and dividing a two-digit number by a one-digit number. In Science, we looked at different types of skeletons and named different bones and muscles in the human body in our Animals including Humans topic. In Geography, we learnt about the rivers, oceans, hills, mountains, counties and countries of the UK. We also began our Faith Explorers lessons, where we aimed to grow our relationship with God further and deepen our understanding of the Sacrament of First Forgiveness.

What we will learn in Block 3

In this block of learning, we will be investigating the question:

How did power, belief and community shape the lives of the Ancient Egyptians?



In R.E. this block, we will continue our **Galilee to Jerusalem** topic until half term. Following this, our topics will focus on **Desert to Garden** and **Ends of the Earth**. Our Faith Explorer lessons will continue to focus on preparing children for the sacraments of First Forgiveness (Reconciliation) and Holy Communion.

In Maths we will move onto our **Fractions** and **Money** topics.

Please encourage your child to keep practising the 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables at home.



In Science we will be looking at **Light** and **Plants**. We will learn about different sources of light, that darkness is the absence of light and how shadows are formed. We will also investigate how plants transport their water and learn about the part flowers play in the life cycle of plants, including pollination, seed dispersal and seed formation.

The children in Year 3 will be working with Year 4 to create an Easter production based on retelling the Easter story. The children will also learn songs which they will then perform. Please watch this space for updates as to how this performance will be shared closer to the time.



P.E. will take place every **Wednesday** and **Thursday** this block. The children will need to come to school on these days wearing their appropriate P.E. kits:

- Plain navy-blue joggers
- Light blue polo shirt
- School cardigan/jumper

Swimming after Easter

The children will begin swimming at Hazel Grove Swimming Pool after Easter. More information will be given near the time.



Homework:

1. Reading books

In Year 3, children should read for 20 minutes every evening and this should be recorded in their reading records. The reading records will be collected on a **Tuesday** and **Friday**, in order for the Year 3 team to monitor the children's reading. **Please ensure your child's reading book and record is in school every day.**

2. Spelling

The children will be given some spelling words to learn on a **Monday** and will be tested on these words the following **Monday**.

Children will be provided with a spellings homework book and they should pick two activities from the spelling activities list to complete each week.

3. Maths

The children will receive a weekly written maths task inside their White Rose Homework books. This task will coincide with learning taking place in the classroom for that week, enabling children to consolidate their understanding of different mathematical strands. The children continue to have access to TTRockstars which they can log into and use to aid their knowledge of times tables. Purple Mash also has lots of Maths games which the children can access from home.

Homework will be set on a **Friday** and is due in for the following **Thursday**.

4. Reading (online)

Online reading homework will be set every **Friday** to be completed by the following Thursday. Children will use Reading Eggspress, which they are familiar with as they used it throughout EYFS and KS1. A comprehension lesson will be set for them to complete that will automatically pop up on screen when they log into their account.
